

Step 13 - The Sound of /n/ Spelled KN
In this lesson, your student will learn words that contain the sound
of /n/ spelled <u>kn</u> .

New Teaching Teach the Sound of /n/ Spelled KN

"Pull down /n /, two-letter /n/ used only at the beginning of a word." Student pulls down the kn tile.

Build the word *know*. kn ow

"In the word know, as in I don't know, the /n/ sound is spelled kn."

"Repeat these words after me, and listen for the /n/ sound: knee, knot, know, knife." Student listens and repeats the words.

"I will dictate some words for you to spell. In each one, the /n/ sound at the beginning of the word is spelled kn."

Dictate the following words:

knock knight knit kneel

New Teaching

(continued)

Teach Two Rule Breakers

Build the word *sure*. **s u r e**

"This word is sure. What sound does the s make in this word?" /sh/.

Take out Word Card 89. "The word *sure* is a Rule Breaker because the \underline{s} says /sh/ instead of /s/. Circle the \underline{s} in this word." *Student fills in the circle with yellow pencil.*

"Spell the word sure on paper." Student writes the word.

Build the word *says*. **s** ay **s**

"This word is *says*, as in *He always says no*. What is the base word of *says*?" *Say*.

"Good. But what sound does the ay make in the word says?" /ĕ/.

Take out Word Card 90. "The word *says* is a Rule Breaker because the <u>ay</u> doesn't say what we expect it to. What do we do with Rule Breakers?" *The student circles the <u>ay</u> and colors the circle yellow*.

"Spell the word says on paper." Student writes the word.

Have your student practice these two words until they become easy.

Read the following sentences and have your student point to the correct word on the Homophones List.

Ted did <u>not</u> do his homework. The moon was full last <u>night</u>. The <u>knight</u> wore heavy armor. Is that a <u>new</u> sweater? Do you <u>know</u> my cousin Bob? The sailor tied the rope in a <u>knot</u>. I <u>knew</u> you'd like that pony! There are <u>no</u> more cookies in the jar.

Dictate several sentences each day.

Rick stuck the knife in the wood. He's the kindest man I've ever known. I knew you could do it! The brave knight helped the king. Knock three times on the window. Do you know how to knit? The frozen food is thawing on the table. I hurt my knee when I fell off the bed. Tie a knot in the fishing wire. Are you sure you want to kneel in the mud? Preheat the oven to cook the beef. Kim didn't know the ring belonged to Beth.




Dictate each word and have your student write it on paper. Then have your student write original sentences using the new words.
