

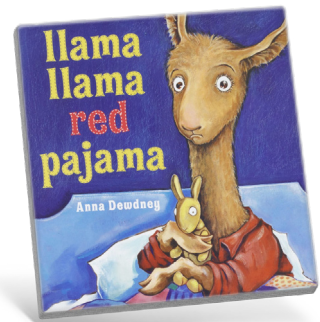
Rhyming Picture Books
