Feed the Puppy

What do you do with words that don't follow the normal rules of spelling? You feed them to a puppy, of course! This adorable activity provides a memorable way for your student to remember Rule Breakers.



Assembly Instructions

1. Print pages 3-8.
2. Cut a slit along the dotted line on the puppy's mouth.
3. Cut out the playing cards for the level you wish to play (Level 2 students use the Level 2 cards, Level 3 students can use the Level 2 or Level 3 cards, and so on). For best results, use only one level of cards per game.

How to Play

1. Choose a card and show it to your student.
2. Ask your student to circle the letter or letters that don't say what we expect them to say. For example, in the word *said*, the letters ai say /ě/ instead of /ā/.
3. Encourage your student to color in the circle to highlight the problem.
4. Feed the Rule Breaker to the puppy! Just slide the Rule Breaker card through the slit.
5. Have your student write the word on paper.
