Achilles was a strong warrior, but he had one weakness—his heel.

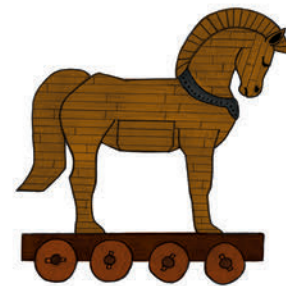

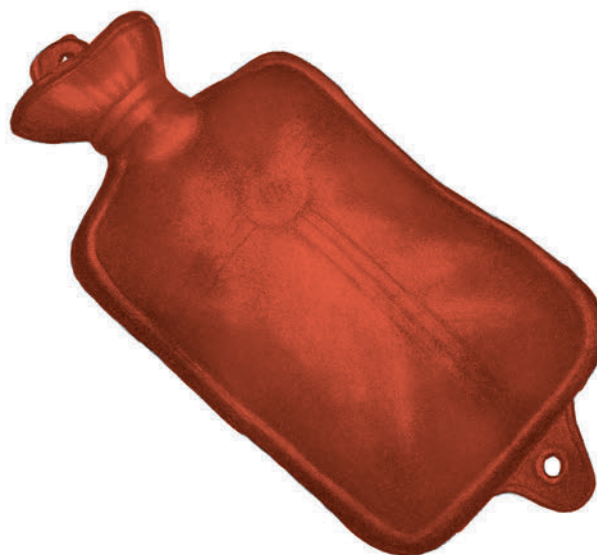
