- 1. Print pages 2-3 (color) or 4-5 (black and white) of this PDF, making sure your printer is set to portrait orientation.

Making Words PURCO

Add S

Most of the time, just add s. scoop → scoops

Add ES

If you hear the sound of /iz/, use es.

dish → dishes

Words Ending in Y

If the word ends in a consonant plus y, change y to i and add es. cherry — cherries

If the word ends in a vowel plus y, just add s.

day → days

Words Ending just add s.

day → days

Words **Ending** in O

If the word ends in a vowel plus o, add s. pistachio --- pistachios

If the word ends in a consonant plus o, add s or es.

(Consult a dictionary if needed.)

hero --- heroes

piano — pianos

Words **Ending in** F or FE

If the word ends in f or fe, we often change the f or fe to v and add es.

loaf → loaves

knife → knives

Some words ending in f don't change when they become plural.

chef → chefs

Irregular Plurals

Irregular plurals don't follow the normal patterns.

child → children tooth → teeth

ice → ice
