Add S


Most of the time, just add s.
scoop $\longrightarrow$ scoops

## Add ES

Words
Ending
in $Y$
If the word ends in a
consonant plus $y$, change y to $i$ and add es.

## cherry $\longrightarrow$ cherries

If the word ends in a vowel plus $y$, just add s. day $\longrightarrow$ days

If the word ends in a vowel plus o , add s . pistachio $\longrightarrow$ pistachios
If the word ends in a consonant plus $\mathbf{0}$, add s or es.
(Consult a dictionary if needed.)
hero $\longrightarrow$ heroes
piano $\longrightarrow$ pianos
Words
Ending in
F or FE
If the word ends in $f$ or $f e$, we often change the $f$ or fe to $v$ and add es.

## Irregular Plurals

Irregular plurals don't follow the normal patterns. child $\longrightarrow$ children tooth $\longrightarrow$ teeth ice $\longrightarrow$ ice

If the word ends in a vowel plus $\mathbf{0}$, add s . pistachio $\longrightarrow$ pistachios
If the word ends in a consonant plus $\mathbf{0}$, add s or es. (Consult a dictionary if needed.)
hero $\longrightarrow$ heroes
piano $\longrightarrow$ pianos

## Words <br> Ending in

For FE
If the word ends in $f$ or $f e$, we often change the $f$ or fe to $v$ and add es.
